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Terms And Conditions

Subsidy Conditions

1. The property must not have exceeded the life-time maximum subsidy amount for each eligible installation.
2. To be eligible for the subsidy:
 - You must be the registered owner of a single-family residential, duplex or triplex property within the City of Toronto.
 - The subsidy is available only to existing homes, not homes in the planning stages or currently under construction.
 - The downspouts from your property’s eavestrough must be disconnected from the sewer system unless you have received an exemption from the City of Toronto.
 - If the property has a paved front yard parking area (“parking pad”), it must comply with the City’s Zoning By-law requirements.
 - You must submit your application within one year of completion of work as indicated on your invoice.
 - A permit must be obtained and inspection passed by a City of Toronto building inspector for a backwater valve.
 - Your contractor must possess a valid City of Toronto business license for the eligible work.
 - Original invoices must be provided.
 - You must not have outstanding taxes or debts owed to the City of Toronto at the time your application is processed.

Acceptance of Subsidy Conditions

In applying for the City of Toronto Basement Flooding Protection Subsidy Program, I understand and agree to the following conditions:

- I am solely responsible for the work being done on my property.
- The City assumes no liability whatsoever relating to the work undertaken to be eligible for the subsidy, and the work cannot be considered a guarantee that basement flooding will not occur.
- The City of Toronto does not:
 - endorse specific brands, products, dealers, or contractors.
 - guarantee materials, workmanship, or performance of the eligible protective devices.
- I will not make any claim or take any action against the City of Toronto for losses, damages, expenses or costs of any nature whatsoever arising out of or related to my participation in the program, and indemnify the City against any such claim or action made or taken by someone else.
- If any incorrect or deceptive information, statement or representation is found in this application or the accompanying documents, the City is entitled to:
 - reject my application,
 - demand full and immediate repayment of any subsidy money paid to me,
 - prosecute me or take other legal action against me.
